Industry Reports: Rose Washington announced that through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) of the United States Government, Tulsa County Commissioners have voted to fund the Tulsa County Business RESET (Resources to Empower Small Enterprises for Tomorrow) Program providing economic support to small businesses and non-profit organizations in the form of forgivable loans and grants, respectively. Information will be distributed to the full Board. Rose Washington announced another program rolled out called the Small Business University. It will help existing businesses think about ways to pivot and provide technical assistance to them as well as any new businesses. Celia Armstrong reported that with COVID-19 not going away anytime soon, Tulsa Teachers Credit Union is building bridges with their diverse workforce to continue to lean in and learn all while keeping employees calm and convert a financial core. TTCU has been focused on celebrating people coming together as an organization and as a community. TTCU has helped their members put almost 2 million dollars back into their pockets towards basic necessities. Kelly Beyer announced that Manpower and Tooling U-SME will be extending through July 17, 2020 their fully funded five-pack course bundle to help displaced workers to enhance or jump start their career in manufacturing.
